SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of First-aid Measures

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1. Extinguishing Media

Suitable Extinguishing Media: Dry chemical, carbon dioxide, water spray, foam.

If sweeping is required use a dust suppressant. Avoid generation of dust during clean-up of spills. Contact competent authorities after a spill.

7.1. Precautions for Safe Handling

Precautions for Safe Handling: Avoid creating or spreading dust.

Hygiene Measures: Handle in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety procedures. Wash hands and other exposed areas with mild soap and water before eating, drinking or smoking and when leaving work.
